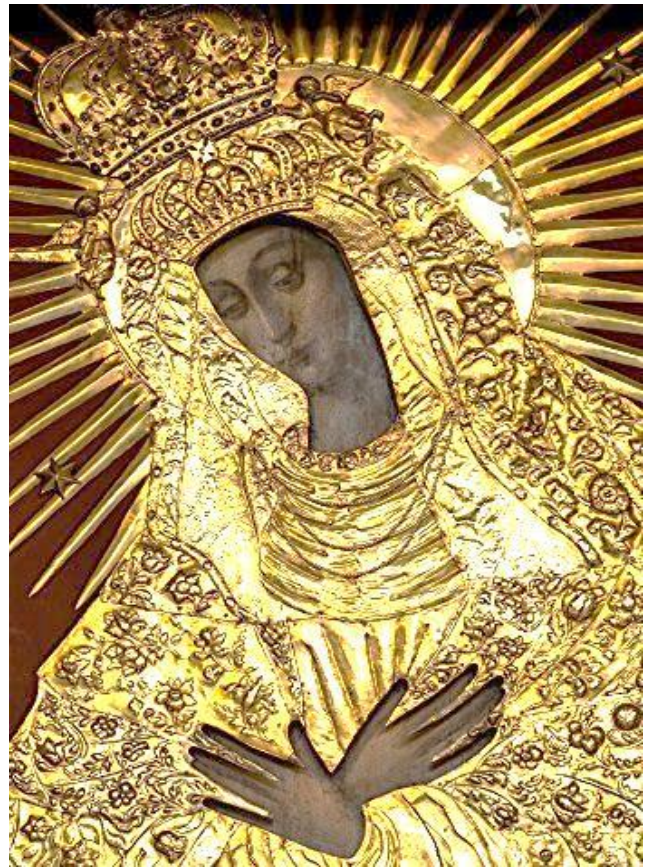
THE MEMORARE
